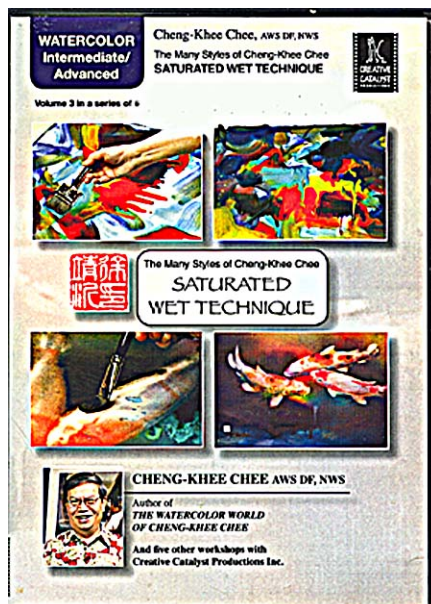

★ DVD Review "Saturated Wet Technique" by Cheng-Knee Chee



This is #3 of a 6 DVD series .

Carol and I have reviewed one other - fascinating!

Cheng introduces this DVD with a study of KOI, or colorful carp, through several of his large paintings that are in the background. He discusses right brain approach, typically considered creative, and compares with left brain, the more objective approach. You must know your subject - he knows fish.

His brushes, large, are shown followed by a complete wetting of both sides of 300# paper. Colors are premixed. He begins with a very wet abstract with lots of strong color. Tilting the board to blend the colors, Cheng finds his first fish and wipes out the color. Then a second fish and a third (the rule of 3) - all by lifting wet paint out of the paper. Over a period of about 2 hours, he defines and refines both shape and form always "designing". Excellent!

NWS Traveling Art Show

The weekend of February 4th, Marilyn Young, Janet Davis, Pat Boldizar and Arleen Barton scooted on over to Bradenton, FL for the opening of the National Watercolor Society (February 1st-March 18th, 2011) traveling show. We dined at Riverside Restaurant for a light dinner, it was beyond spectacular.

The NWS reception was at Art Center Manatee Museum (artcentermanatee.org). Two jazz musicians entertained while caterers passed hors d'oeuvres. The work was varied and beyond inspiring. Each painting was compelling in its own way. Carol Frye, who lives in the Bradenton area, had a magnificent abstract in the show. The local Florida Suncoast Watercolor Society also held their opening reception and we enjoyed paintings by Diane Schmidt and Ann Abgott, among others.



Later, we visited the nearby Village of the Arts, at 926 12th Street West. Numerous small historic homes have been converted to galleries for 3-6 artists. The Artists and their works are very eclectic. We found one-of-a-kind basket weaving, underwater photography, wire jewelry & paintings.

Saturday we drove to the new Dali Museum on Tampa Bay in St. Petersburg. The architecture is very unusual with unique glass projections made by men who worked on the Louvre. Dali's displayed work showed paintings from his earliest through the 1970s. He is totally weird and sexually oriented due to being mistreated as a child. His works of warped images were not there (well, not the clocks). Along the Bay, we lunched at a charming restaurant among the numerous delightful shops displaying art. We especially enjoyed Shapiro's, 300 Beach Dr. E, St. Pete, jewelry, and accessories store, near the Chihuli Gallery. No, we didn't buy a Chihuli, we just drooled and photographed them.



The weekend was an artist's dream and we enjoyed every bit of it.
